

# **PASTOR'S HILSEN**



Being in Norway is quite fascinating in many ways. I am in Norway when I write this, to renew my visa.

First of all, it is interesting to

notice what can be news here. I read in a newspaper the other day some comments about how dangerous it is for our health that we change time, one hour ahead in the spring, and one hour back in the fall.

When we look into the world today, with all its challenges, it is actually fascinating that this topic can be news at all. But, as we say, it is much more important that your own goldfish dies than that ten thousand children die in Africa. And that news about our health seems to be quite narrow sighted.

I hope that we are not as narrow sighted when we look into the challenges for our Christian faith today. When you ask young people, or children around the world, you will see that kids either do not care at all about religion, or some of them care so much that they might become dangerous, because they think that their god demands that they kill for what they believe is a just cause.

Maybe I can understand what a friend of me wrote on Facebook: If it had not been for Jesus, I might have become an atheist. The different religions just give me nothing.

Well, if that is true, we should really do something. Because we should live out the love and care of Jesus to every single person that we meet. I pray and hope that people like my Facebook friend can be able to see that the love of Jesus is still here, spread by us, his followers.

#### **ART & EXHIBITS COMMITTEE**

Throughout the last 100 years Mindekirken has accumulated many photographs, works of arts and historical artifacts representing its history and cultural ties to Norway. What has now become a large collection has been arranged and displayed throughout the many available spaces throughout the church. You have no doubt walked by them in the foyer, along the hallways and staircases. You see them while sitting in the Fellowship Hall or in one of the other basement rooms: Oslo, Bergen or Nidaros. Yet as MIndekirken grows into the next century, space is required to provide a special place for rotating exhibits to engage viewers, providing information regarding its history, traditions and background information for upcoming events.

In response to a need to organize and plan exhibits as well as protect and preserve our present collections, the Art and Exhibits Committee has been established. This committee is being led by Erik Pratt and reports to the deacons. Its primary missions are as follows:

- 1) Conduct an inventory of our present collection and mechanism for preservation. Where and when were these pictures or objects obtained? What do they represent?. How can we assure that they are protected? All pictures and documents will be scanned and saved. A procedure of how to store and protect pictures that may be temporarily removed for a display is under development.
- 2) Develop an ongoing rotation of special exhibits to highlight upcoming celebrations and to enhance self guided tours of the church. A few ideas for special exhibits might include a history of Mindekirken in photos, immigrant faces, Norwegian immigrants through 200 years, descendants of immigrants, who is our neighbor and Christianity and churches in Norway.
- 3) Develop a mechanism to coordinate with other committees within the church who have needs for permanent and temporary signage.

Ideas and suggestions from members of the congregation are welcomed. Please note that the hallway outside of the Fellowship Hall has the first temporary exhibit of Mindekirken's Syttende Mai festivals. The pictures that were removed to provide space for this exhibition are being prepared for scanning and storage.

# TRUSTEES REPORT

I am very pleased to announce that we have filled our part-time volunteer/program coordinator position. She was in our own backyard! Welcome to Synneva Bratland (pictured), who started on May 13. Synneva is a language instructor for the Mindekirken Norwegian Language and Culture Program. Synneva also works part time for Norway House's newspaper, The Norwegian American. She is a graduate of St Olaf College and spent a year attending Follo Folkehøgskole in Norway. Synneva also attended and worked at Skogfjorden for many years. She is fully immersed in the Norwegian community. Please welcome her when you see her!



I want to express thanks for the requests that we made to the Mindekirken Foundation that were approved at their April board meeting:

- Mini-split for hallway near kitchen \$3,500 improve comfort level in lower level.
- Thermostats were added for the two mini-splits that were installed in 2022 in the Sanctuary \$1000 to better manage comfort level.
- Chain link fence installed to protect condenser units for mini-splits installed in Fellowship Hall, Kitchen and Sacristy \$2,800 secure from theft and vandalism.

We are continuing to work on a number of projects, that were reported in the May Communicator and have no new updates. Summer is a quiet time in the church. I anticipate we will be able to take a number of items off of our list.

#### MINDEKIRKEN FOUNDATION

The Mindekirken Foundation Board first quarter meeting was held April 24, 2024. The financials were reviewed and the GS investment advisors reported on the investment portfolio. Fund raising was discussed. A joint fundraising letter was sent at the end of the year with the church's year end giving letter. The Julebord that was held in January, for the first time at Norway House, has also been a good fund raiser for the foundation and the foundation is planning on doing it again in January 2025. Grants to the church totaled \$49,791 in 2023. Please consider a donation to the Mindekirken Foundation. Adrian Wear is the new Treasurer, taking over from Peter Storvick, whose term ended. Margy Sather Peterson is a new board member.



# Tuesday Open House Seminar: Norwegian Immigration to North America

June 25, 2024, 9:00 am to approximately 3:30 pm (doors open at 8:30 am for coffee)

Location: Mindekirken, The Norwegian Lutheran Memorial Church, Fellowship Hall 924 East 21st Street, Minneapolis, MN Suggested Donation of \$25 (includes presentations, lunch and coffee breaks)

This year we are in preparation for the bicentennial for the 200th anniversary of the first organized group from Norway to North America. Some may not know that the Norwegians were great colonizers and have traveled many places in the world long before 1825 and the ship Restauration.

This seminar will explore the arrivals beginning with the Vikings and moving toward the settling of Norwegians in Canada and the United States. Some of the arrival times are surprising and those after 1825 came in waves. Topics will address the first arrivals together with some narrative history of women who arrived during the Colonial Era. This will be followed by immigration waves and how they traveled in sailing ships and steamships. The seminar will close with a panel addressing various times and how our immigrants assimilated into American Society.


