FROM THE PRESIDENT

By the time you receive the April Communicator it is possible Easter Sunday has already been celebrated. If not, wishing you all Happy Easter and then perhaps you still might also be able to obtain a ticket to the Easter brunch in Fellowship hall. We are grateful to Charlotte, Mary and volunteers who all make such events so festive. Many years have gone by since last we gathered after Easter church service for an authentic "norsk påskefrokost".

Our request to become a Friendship Church with Pastor Jorunn Raddum's home church in Arendal, the Trinity Church (trefoldighetskirken), has been officially approved by their Church Council. It is now time for us to acknowledge to them this new friendship. Jorunn will be substituting for Pastor Gunnar here at Mindekirken during September and November. During her stay we will schedule a time to converse with her about our new Friendship church in Arendal.

During the early part of March, our neighborhood experienced increased violence one day. This was NOT OK with our good neighbors who live here in Ventura Village. They have become even more engaged to protect their peace and quiet where they live and raise their children.

We, along with Norway House, wish to support neighbors in ways we are able. However, it's our neighbors themselves who will be working directly with their elected officials whose attention they now have.

We have a wonderful group of neighbors around Mindekirken; several have become our good friends and look out for us and for our property.

The Edvard Grieg Society of Minnesota (a 501c3 organization) has become a regular participant in the Musical life here at Mindekirken. Their concerts will primarily be held at our church. They will use our address. We are very enthused about this new relationship with EGSMN. Let's support them when concerts are held here.

Our Church Council met in Fellowship Hall on Saturday the 16th of March for our annual Mini-retreat. Ever since introduction of Zoom meetings we have not met in person but once a year. Always plenty of topics for discussion. This year we welcomed back to Council, Jennifer Thue, serving as our Secretary.

Shortly before the meeting we had learned the good news that Gunnar had been approved for the second half of his 5-year visa. We had called him to Mindekirken on 1 September 2021 for a period of 3 years; except the visa is only granted for 2 ½ years. Following is a message from Gunnar himself:

"The Council at Mindekirken has started the process where we discuss how we should call pastors in the future. In October, 2022, when Norway's presiding bishop Tveit visited our church, he said we cannot expect pastors from Norway in the coming years, as they are also experiencing a shortage of pastors. This matter will be discussed in the coming months and we want all our members and friends to take part in this process....Gunnar.."




