
Visit from the President of the Norwegian Parliament

TRUSTEES REPORT

Summertime when activities slow down at the church will give us an opportunity to work on maintaining the church, cleaning floors, carpets, and windows among other projects. We are still working with the insurance and roofing company for repairing the roof from hail damage last year. We also have loose flashing, unrelated to the hail damage that needs to be fixed.

Reviewing the old files of paperwork is an on-going project this year, being worked on by Tom Lanman and Tom Peterson.

We are looking at estimates to upgrade the audio in the fellowship hall and sanctuary. We are also working on getting an estimate for the hanging of the ship that Hans Sandom has been working on.

The technology committee is also reviewing replacing the server that is at the end of its life. We are also looking for a company that can help us with technical issues.

We are also looking for another volunteer for the recording of services on Sunday.

One of the projects Terry Parker has been working on is setting up the network for the cameras and smoke alarms that were installed this spring.

A new building attendant, Kelsi Lindstrom, has just been hired.

We are also looking to replace/add signage in the parking lot and the outside of the church.

NOW HIRING ORGANIST

We are currently hiring for the position of organist. There are two services a Sunday, one in English and one in Norwegian, except for the last Sunday of the month when there is one bilingual service. This position also includes accompanying the choir during services and choir practice (Thursday evenings 7:00-8:30 p.m., Sept.-May). In addition to regular Sundays, the organist is expected to play for the regular High Holy days of the year. Occasional funerals and weddings are negotiated and invoiced separately. Annual Compensation starts at \$20,577.

The Norwegian American Presents: The Democracy Center

Norway House's newspaper, The Norwegian American, created a new gallery exhibit in the Joan and Walter Mondale Galleri.

The exhibit's inspiration stems from our Editor-in-Chief, Lori Ann Reinhall's impressions from a recent visit to Norway's Constitution Museum at Eidsvoll. Together, adults and children learn about the history of the 1814 Norwegian Constitution, which was largely inspired by the U.S. Constitution.

Thanks to the support of donors and the Ventura Village Neighborhood Association, the exhibit features a children's activity corner at Norway House to create a similar experience for visitors of all ages.

The exhibit is presented to the public free of charge.

Perceptions of Norway — Portraits of Contemporary Norwegians by Nancy Bundt

In celebration of its 20th Anniversary, Norway House is proud to present a special encore showing of Nancy Bundt's Perceptions of Norway exhibit on the walls of the K.A.H.R. Innovation + Culture Center. This hit show was last displayed in the Galleri at Norway House in 2018.

Perceptions of Norway seeks to expand common perceptions of Norwegians and their culture. Through the eyes of a fellow American, photographer Nancy Bundt — an expat residing in Norway for 25 years — guests to the exhibit will be able to witness the stories of a diverse group of Norwegians. These stories will allow guests to consider their own relationships with Norway while also discovering a renewed excitement for the culture by connecting their own stories with those of Norwegians today.







ARTS & EXHIBITS COMMITTEE



In June a new exhibit was installed in the Annex and hallway to the sanctuary area. The Seven Summers: Paintings from Boverdalen by Arna Rennan. We are sharing the exhibit with Norway House. The exhibit first opened in Duluth, the hometown of the artist. It went from there to Vesterheim Museum in Decorah, Iowa.

Arna has returned to the source of her inspiration as a plein air painter in Bøverdalen, a valley in Northern Gudbrandsdalen where she spent seven summers working at the traditional Hotel Roisheim. During this time, Arna listened eagerly to stories of local history, folklore, folk music and learned to dance. The surroundings held a sense of timelessness with the powerful presence of unchanging mountains, farms dating back to the middle-ages, continuity of culture and lifestyle. But first and foremost, the dense, rich, ever-changing colors and atmospheric effects on the familiar faces of the mountains in this valley have inspired Arna's desire to capture the nuances to her canvas.

Arna Rennan is a painter who is in direct contact with nature with her easel outdoors, on location. She has painted in this manner for over thirty years. This began when she returned to her home town of Duluth Minnesota after many years in the arts community in Oslo Norway. It is her way of reuniting and becoming a part of her environment. She

currently resides in Lom where she enjoys the challenge of painting the subject matter that has called her for many years in her minds eye.






